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NOTICE OF MEETING OF THE ARIZONA STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS’ ANESTHESIA AND SEDATION COMMITTEE

Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S”) § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the Arizona State Board of Dental Examiners’ (“Board”) **Anesthesia and Sedation Committee** (“Committee”) and to the general public that the Committee will hold a meeting open to the public on **Friday, February 5, 2021 at 1:00 p.m.** The meeting will be held in Boardroom C located at 1740 West Adams Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85007. One or more Committee members may participate virtually or telephonically. If members of the public choose *not* to attend the meeting in-person, they may also choose to participate in-person or virtually/telephonically. The meeting is open to the public. However, during the course of the meeting, the Committee, upon a majority vote of a quorum of the members, may, when necessary, hold an executive session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) and/or (3) as indicated on the Committee’s Agenda. The executive session is not open to the public.

Anesthesia & Sedation Committee Meeting Agenda

The Anesthesia & Sedation Committee’s (“Committee”) Chairperson reserves the right to change the order of items on the agenda, except for public hearings set for a specific time.

During the Committee meeting and upon a vote of the majority of a quorum, the Committee may go into executive session to obtain legal advice from the Board’s attorney(s) pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S.”) § 38-431.03(A)(3) on any agenda items listed on the agenda. All meeting attendees whose presence is not required in an executive session will be required to leave the meeting room during executive session. Any and all legal action will take place in open session.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

II. CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.01(H), the Committee may make an open call to the public during a public meeting, subject to reasonable time, place and manner restrictions, to allow individuals to address the public body on any issue within the jurisdiction of the public body. However, members of the Committee are not allowed to discuss or take legal action on matters raised during an open call to the public unless the matters are properly noticed for discussion and legal action. The Committee, however, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda.

III. REVIEW, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Continue to review, discuss and establish framework/guidelines for conducting a study/review of adverse occurrence reports to help identify issues or concerns that may necessitate statutory or rule changes.

V. STUDY/REVIEW OF ADVERSE OCCURRENCE REPORTS

Upon a vote of the majority of a quorum, the Committee may go into executive session, pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) to discuss or consider records exempt, by law, from public inspection, including the receipt and discussion of information or testimony that is specifically required to be maintained as confidential by state or federal law.

VI. CURRENT STATUTE(S) AND/OR RULE(S) REGARDING ANESTHESIA & SEDATION STATUTE AND RULES

Committee to review and discuss current statutes and rules regarding anesthesia & sedation and may make recommendations to the Board regarding whether statutory or rule change(s) should be pursued.

VII. BENEFITS OF A TEAM MODEL, A TWO-PROVIDER MODEL OR A SINGLE PROVIDER MODEL WHEN ADMINISTERING ANESTHESIA/SEDATION

Committee to review, discuss and take possible action to recommend that the Board amend its statutes/rules regarding the most appropriate model(s) to use based on level(s) of anesthesia/sedation administered to patients.

VIII. ARIZONA ASSOCIATION OF NURSE ANESTHETISTS (“AZANA”)

Committee to review and discuss the AZANA’s request for changes to the Board’s anesthesia and sedation rules and may take possible action to recommend that the Board include language or amend or eliminate rules based on the AZANA’s request.
