### OF THE ARIZONA STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS’ ANESTHESIA AND SEDATION COMMITTEE


Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S”) § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the Arizona State Board of Dental Examiners’ (“Board”) **Anesthesia and Sedation Committee** (“Committee”) and to the general public that the Committee will hold a meeting open to the public on **Tuesday, April 20, 2021 at 2:30 p.m.** Due to the COVID-19 virus, the meeting will be virtual and members of the public may access the meeting by dialing 252.365.5021 followed the meeting pin – 783 770 973# or by video conferencing through this link: [meet.google.com/mkg-zayv-xzr](https://meet.google.com/mkg-zayv-xzr) After the start of the meeting, the Committee chairperson and/or staff will request that members of the public place their phones/devices on mute. All the members, of the Committee, will participate in the meeting by virtual communications.

The meeting is open to the public. However, during the course of the meeting, the Committee, upon a majority vote of a quorum of the members, may, when necessary, hold an executive session pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) and/or (3) as indicated on the Committee’s Agenda. The executive session is not open to the public.

Information concerning the Committee’s Agenda, including a copy of the Agenda and any amendments, can be obtained at the Board’s office, through the Board’s website at <https://dentalboard.az.gov/> or by calling the Board’s office at 602.241.1492 The Committee Agenda is subject to change up to 24 hours prior to the meeting. Agenda items are noted by number and letter for convenience and reference. The Committee may address the agenda items in any order within the time frame, if any, indicated and may set over matters to a later time when necessary. The Committee reserves the right to change the order of the agenda items, except for matters set for a specific time.

## **Anesthesia & Sedation Committee Meeting Agenda**

The Anesthesia & Sedation Committee’s (“Committee”) Chairperson reserves the right to change the order of items on the agenda, except for public hearings set for a specific time.

During the Committee meeting and upon a vote of the majority of a quorum, the Committee may go into executive session to obtain legal advice from the Board’s attorney(s) pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (“A.R.S.”) § 38-431.03(A)(3) on any agenda items listed on the agenda. All meeting attendees whose presence is not required in an executive session will be required to leave the meeting room during executive session. Any and all legal action will take place in open session.

### **I. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL**

### **II. CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.01(H), the Committee may make an open call to the public during a public meeting, subject to reasonable time, place and manner restrictions, to allow individuals to address the public body on any issue within the jurisdiction of the public body. However, members of the Committee are not allowed to discuss or take legal action on matters raised during an open call to the public unless the matters are properly noticed for discussion and legal action. The Committee, however, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda.

### **III. REVIEW, DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES**

A. Discussion and approval of the Open Session Minutes from the March 19, 2021 committee meeting.

### **IV. CURRENT STATUTE(S) AND/OR RULE(S) REGARDING ANESTHESIA & SEDATION**

Committee to review and discuss current statutes and rules regarding anesthesia & sedation and may make recommendations to the Board regarding amending the statutes and/or rules to better protect the public while continuing to provide access to care.

### **V. CERTIFIED NURSE ANESTHETISTS (“CRNA”) IN A DENTAL OFFICE**

Committee to review and discuss A.A.C. R4-11-1304, and the results of a survey of 12 U.S. jurisdictions regarding CRNAs providing anesthesia/sedation in a dental office, and may take action to recommend that the Board amend its statutes/rules based on the discussion and the survey results.

**VI. AMERICAN SOCIETY OF DENTIST ANESTHESIOLOGISTS' ("ASDA")  
PROPOSED STATE SEDATION/GENERAL ANESTHESIA RULES**

Committee to review and discuss ASDA's proposed sedation/general anesthesia rules and may take action to recommend that the Board amend its rules based on the Committee's review of ASDA's proposal(s).

**VII. STUDY/REVIEW OF ADVERSE OCCURRENCE REPORTS**

Review and discuss adverse occurrence reports and collective spreadsheet to help identify issues or concerns that may necessitate statutory and/or rule changes. Upon a vote of the majority of a quorum, the Committee may go into executive session, pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) to discuss or consider records exempt, by law, from public inspection, including the receipt and discussion of information or testimony that is specifically required to be maintained as confidential by state or federal law.

**VIII. SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS**

By law, the summary of current events is limited to summarizing recent occurrences. The Board cannot propose, discuss, deliberate or take legal action on any matter in the summary unless the specific matter is properly noticed for legal action.
